**What:** Finish Phase 1 planting of 1,500 native trees and shrubs at Boistfort Valley Farm.

**When:** Saturday, November 7, 9:30am to 2:00pm?

**Why:** To improve salmon habitat, stabilize the south fork of the Chehalis River, and help protect Boistfort Valley Farm during future flooding events.

**Who:** Interested community members. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

**Notes:** Please bring shovels, water bottles, and a sack lunch. Wear layers, raingear, and waterproof boots. We'll provide extra shovels, gloves, hot cocoa, and cookies!
